Studio focus

Introducing the print studio! Alison Ayres and Chris Deane run the studio over four days: Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Both bring different techniques and skills to our students.

Alison started working at Rowan as a part-time print tutor in October 2022, but had already been working with us through her other role in the Learning Team at the Fitzwilliam Museum.

I have invited Rowan students and staff to explore the museum collections and exhibitions, taking time to sit and draw. A special partnership has developed between Rowan and the museum. In 2019 Rowan students were invited to be part of a community-wide voice in a major exhibition which saw their artworks on display in the galleries of the museum. This resulted in the museum purchasing a ceramic piece of art made by the students for the collection

Emily enjoys sitting and drawing in the museum galleries which provides inspiration for her art making in the studios at Rowan. Aidan followed in his brother's footsteps and joined Rowan alongside attending Cambridge Regional College.

He has now been with us for more than a year attending once a week in the wood and print studio.



At the beginning of the year, Rowan joined with the Friends of Cherry Hinton Brook and Sainsbury's on Brooks Road to create a large-scale mural that pays homage to the wildlife of one of the city's lesser-known chalk streams. Celebrating 40 years of Rowan



Next year marks 40 years of Rowan and we're hoping you'll help us Raise the Roof in celebration!

Our beloved art centre has been plagued by a leaky roof for far too long. Despite our best efforts to patch up the problem, the damage now is just too great and our temporary fixes themselves need fixing as the roof poses a health and safety risk to our staff, volunteers, and students.
